## Amendment II

**A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed.**



JOHN HANCOCK, a Delegate from Massachusetts; born in Quincy, Norfolk County, Mass., January 12, 1737; pursued classical studies; was graduated from Harvard College in 1754; a selectman of Boston several terms; member of the provincial legislature 1766-1772; president of the Provincial Congress in 1774; Member of the Continental Congress

1775-1778 and served as President of the Congress from May 24, 1775, to October 1777; first signer of the Declaration of Independence; served as senior major general of Massachusetts Militia during the Revolutionary War; member of the Massachusetts constitutional convention in 1780; Governor of Massachusetts 1780-1785; was again elected President of the Continental Congress on November 23, 1785, but resigned May 29, 1786, not having served on account of illness; again Governor of Massachusetts from 1787 until his death in Quincy, Mass., October 8, 1793; interment in Old Granary Burying Ground, Boston, Mass.

## The Declaration of Independence

No other document written before or since better describes the essence of the transformation that the Founding Fathers wanted to bring about in the way people are governed.

From the second paragraph of the Declaration of Independence:

“We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.--That to

secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, ...”  
In CONGRESS, July 4, 1776

**The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America**

Prior to this declaration all power was held by the rulers and ruling class who decided what privileges the population would be allowed.

A handwritten signature of John Hancock in cursive script, written in black ink on a light-colored background.

Upon signing this document John Hancock the President of the Continental Congress declared:

“There, I guess King George will be able to read that!”

John Hancock

The *Declaration* railed against the tyranny of King George III. Today we are suffering from the tyranny of the judicial, legal and bureaucratic system we currently have in place. If John Hancock were alive today he would be targeting these entities as the source of his discontent. Witness this quote by John Hancock:

"Some boast of being friends to government; I am a friend to righteous government, to a government founded upon the principles of reason and justice; but I glory in publicly avowing my eternal enmity to tyranny."

John Hancock, March 5, 1774, Oration on the Anniversary of the Boston Massacre of 1770

This is our heritage. Many men died in the establishment of our Independence. We have

## Florida 2021 Legislative Session

Although the regular legislative session convenes on Tuesday March 2<sup>nd</sup>, interim committee meetings are already taking place.

The Republicans still hold a majority of the seats in both the Senate (R24 to D16) and the House (R78 to D42). However, it is the Republicans we have to worry about as they in the last session were greatly influenced by public pressure and bribery and coercion by antigun groups. Many bad bills were introduced in 2020 fortunately pressure by SACFLA and other gun rights organization stopped them from being enacted.

As of this writing there are already 56 firearms related bills submitted for the 2021 Legislative session.

## Bills that we Support

[HB 123](#) - Carrying of Firearms Without Licenses - 2021 – by Rep. Anthony Sabatini (R)  
Removes requirement that license to carry concealed firearm is required in order to carry such firearm; limits areas in which concealed carrying of firearm is prohibited; revises criminal penalties; revises provisions relating to carrying of concealed weapons by nonresidents; provides for issuance of concealed carry licenses for reciprocity purposes; specifies that person not otherwise prohibited by law from possessing firearm may own, possess, & lawfully use firearms & other weapons, ammunition, & supplies for lawful purposes. *This bill is a Constitutional Carry bill. The first committee that is referred to is the Criminal Justice and Public Safety Subcommittee use the same ACTION that is used for HB 6001. As much as we would like this bill pass the prospects are slim.*

[HB 259](#) - Safety of Religious Institutions - 2021 by Jayer Williamson (R)  
Safety of Religious Institutions: Authorizes concealed weapons or firearms license holders to carry a firearm on certain property of church, synagogue, or any other religious institution. Identical to [SB-498](#) by Joe Gruters

[HB 6001](#) - Licenses to Carry Concealed Weapons or Firearms - 2021- by Rep Anthony Sabatini (R)  
Removes provision prohibiting concealed carry licensees from openly carrying handgun or carrying concealed weapon or firearm into college or university facility. *Three actions need to be taken to move this bill forward.*

1. *Encourage our Senators to sponsor a similar bill in the Senate.*
2. *Call and email your state representative and ask them to co-sponsor HB 6001 Licenses to Carry Concealed Weapons or Firearms.*
3. *Call and email Representative Cord Byrd, Chairman of the Criminal Justice and*

*Public Safety Subcommittee and ask him to put HB 6001 on his next committee agenda.*

[HB 6005](#) - Restrictions on Firearms and Ammunition During Emergencies - 2021 - by Rep. Anthony Sabatini (R)

Repeals provisions relating to specified automatic restrictions on firearms & ammunition during certain declared emergencies. Effective Date: upon becoming a law. *Three actions need to be taken to move this bill forward.*

1. *Encourage our Senators to sponsor a similar bill in the Senate.*
2. *Call and email your state representative and ask them to co-sponsor HB 6005 Restrictions on Firearms and Ammunition During Emergencies.*
3. *Call and email Representative Thomas J. "Tom" Leek, Chairman of the Pandemics & Public Emergencies Committee and ask him to put HB 6005 on his next committee agenda.*

## Bills that we do not Support

[HB 25](#) Requires a background check for ammunition sales and will most certainly end the online and mail order sale of ammunition -- and could possibly drive-up prices locally due to the increased workload on local dealers. In an attempt to trick uninformed gun owners into mistakenly supporting HB 25, they have also introduced HB 27 making background check records exempt from “online sunshine” public records requests.

## Bills we don't Support *from page 3*

[HB 167](#) - Sale, Transfer, or Storage of Firearms - 2021 – by Rep. Christine Hunschofsky (D)  
This is a mandatory storage bill that requires firearms to be locked up in your home, making self-defense in the event of a home invasion close to impossible. Requires seller of firearm to provide each purchaser with specified information; revises standard for adults & minors to be criminally negligent in storage of firearm; revises exception to prohibition on storing loaded firearm within reach or easy access of minor who obtains it & commits certain violation. Similar to [SB-428](#)

[SB 186](#) is a radical gun confiscation scheme that goes far beyond the (Federal) Lautenberg Amendment on Domestic Violence. It does so by making so called “Red Flag” gun confiscation Laws even worse by allowing more frivolous claims to be filed against an innocent person. SB 186 denies people their Fourth Amendment rights and Second Amendment rights, all in one bill.

[SB 294](#) - Storage of Loaded Firearms - 2021 by Sen. Gary Farmer (D)  
Storage of Loaded Firearms; Dictating the locations and circumstances in which a loaded firearm is required to be kept and secured with a trigger lock or cable lock; deleting exceptions and criminalizing storage not meeting certain mandates.

[SB 330](#) is a bill that makes selling, giving or loaning a firearm to a friend, neighbor or family member without FDLE approval a criminal offense. We call it a “sell a gun to a friend and go to jail” bill.

[SB 370](#) is a semi-automatic firearm and magazine ban bill, similar to the Clinton/Biden/Schumer gun ban in effect from 1994 – 2004. However, there is no sunset clause, and you can't transfer ownership of the pre-banned items since they must be registered to you. Of course, you know that registration leads to eventual confiscation.

[SB 372](#) is a ban on homemade firearms and parts and 80% receivers -- and even goes so far to target 3D printing.

[SB 672](#) and [HB 6033](#) Repeal Preemption of Firearms and Ammunition Regulation - 2021 by Annette Taddeo (D)  
This would repeal the states preemption laws that forbid any municipality from passing their own gun control laws. That means that if this bill passes, there would be a patch work of laws that ban firearms and magazines across the state.



## Federal Level Legislation

**There are as you might expect from a Democrat dominated Legislature a great many troubling bills. Because the 117<sup>th</sup> Congress is just beginning and their focus is now on the impeachment of private citizen Donald J. Trump, so many of these bills are in their infancy and the full text of them is not yet available.**

## Second Amendment Sanctuary Counties and States

### America is Not a Democracy

Our American founding established a constitutional republic (not a democracy) in which "we the people" are sovereign. We have the absolute legal, moral, and unalienable authority to either give or withdraw the conditional consent we give to government whenever it tyrannically attempts to violate our natural rights and/or constitutional guarantees.

Any statutory law or Federal overreach that tries to allow government to exceed its delegated, fiduciary powers is inherently null and void; and every jury, therefore, should be made aware of the fact that as "the sovereign citizens" they are the true judges of both the facts and the law itself. Believe it or not our current Sheriff Ric Bradshaw was our sheriff at that time. After extensive searching I have not found a copy of this letter.

Regardless of what has happened in the past the prospect of Palm Beach County or our Sheriff declaring us a Sanctuary County for firearms or for Laws that violate the Constitution are slim to none. This endeavor needs to be pursued on the state level.

Because this idea of having our State Government declaring us as a State that will refuse to honor any Law or Executive Order that is contrary to the Constitution of the United States will need extensive research, development and planning we will leave this subject to our next newsletter that is already in the works.

## Gun sales in January set a new record after Capitol Hill insurrection

(CNN) -- The Capitol Hill insurrection and the inauguration of a Democratic president who campaigned on [strengthening gun control measures](#) helped the firearms industry set a January gun sales record last month, according to the latest gun-related background checks data released Monday.

Gun merchants sold more than 2 million firearms in January, a 75% increase over the estimated 1.2 million guns sold in January 2020, according to the National Shooting Sports Federation, a firearms industry trade group. The NSSF said three of the top 10 weeks for FBI instant criminal background checks came last month.

It's not unusual for gun sales to spike when a Democrat wins the White House. The [election](#) and re-election of Barack Obama in 2008 and 2012 were both followed by [gun sale surges](#).

## NRA Sues Fairfax County for Unconstitutional Ban on Firearms in Parks

FRIDAY, JANUARY 29, 2021



**FAIRFAX, Va.** — The National Rifle Association teamed with three Virginia residents and filed a lawsuit on Friday against Fairfax County for their unconstitutional ban on firearm possession in parks and in areas adjacent to certain events.

“The ban on firearms in parks and on trails in Fairfax County is dangerous and unconstitutional,” said Amy Hunter, spokeswoman, NRA. “While all of us hope that parks are safe and beautiful havens, the reality is that assaults, sexual assaults and other violent crimes can and do occur at parks. Furthermore, parks are some of the few places people can go during the COVID-19 pandemic, and law-abiding people should be able to defend themselves and their loved ones should the need arise. These parks are vast and have isolated locations. Because Fairfax County cannot guarantee individual safety, people should be able to take the necessary precautions.”

There are 23,584 acres of parks and 334 miles of trails in Fairfax County. Since 2014, there have been many crimes in Virginia parks, many of them gang-related. Some of the more serious headline-grabbing crimes include murder, kidnap, sexual assault, assault and a horrific decapitation.


